H3 Children and young people are physically healthy and have a healthy lifestyle

Swindon Aims

SS1: Children and young people looked after will have improved security, stability, education and health

SS2: Children and young people are safe from maltreatment, violence, neglect and sexual exploitation

SS3: Children and young people are safe from crime, anti-social behaviour, bullying and discrimination in and out of school

SS4: Children and young people are safe from accidental injury and death

Swindon Aims

EAI: All children and young people achieve challenging but realistic personal educational targets and overall educational standards at primary and secondary school improve

EA2: Children and young people are ready for, attend and enjoy school

EA3: Children and young people achieve personal and social development, have places to go and things to do

Swindon Aims

MPI: Young people will be enterprising, law abiding and positive in their behaviour in and out of school

MP2: Children and young people will take part in decision making, support the community and environment

MP3: Children and young people develop positive relationships, deal positively with changes in their lives and choose not to bully or discriminate

AE1: Young people are ready for and engage in further education, employment and training when leaving school

AE2: Children and young people live in decent homes and free from poverty

AE3: Children and young people live in sustainable communities with access to transport
